Parents: MCC has installed a new key fob entry system for employees both at West Elementary and the Central building. This new system will also roll out our new locked door policy where all doors will remain locked during the school day to increase safety and security for both employees and your children.

For parents, guests, and other visitors; there will be three "main" entrance points that you must enter during school hours. These are:

- (1) West Elementary (east entry by the flagpole)
- (2) Central High School (north entry on 28th St.)
- (3) Central High School (east handicap entry on 28th St.)

In each of these locations listed above, you will be able to enter into the heated foyer and then push a door bell/camera/audio device that will ring into the office and they will grant you access and remind you to check-in at the respective office.

Entry doors will remain unlocked during the morning drop-off and afternoon dismissal time. Doors will lock at 8:15 am at Central and 8:30 am at West Elementary. Doors will open again at 3:00 pm at Central and 3:10 pm at West. When picking up your children, please wait until doors are scheduled to be unlocked unless of course you have an appointment that causes your child to leave before the regular scheduled dismissal.

We have not had any major concerns in the past regarding security or safety for our students and staff but the district is looking to be proactive in these measures. Our district receives earmarked money that must be spent on "Safe School" initiatives and this is the money that we have used for this installation.

We understand that this change is different than what has been done in the past and it may also add a few seconds to your visit to the schools but we are always looking out for what is in the best interest and safety of our kids.
